The duty to manage asbestos is stipulated in Regulation 4 of the Control of Asbestos Regulations 2012 and failure to comply with these obligations can result in prosecution under the Health and Safety at Work Act, 1974.

Asbestos is a category 1 human carcinogen

It is a legal requirement that organisations know whether their premises contain asbestos, and, if so, where it is and what condition it is in, assess the risk and make a plan to manage that risk and act upon it.
